CHECKLIST OF SOME CHANGES REQUIRING REVIEW OF ESTATE PLAN

It is a good practice to review your estate plan every few years and consider the potential effects of the occurrence of any of the following events. Your Will may need to be amended by a Codicil or revised in its entirety -- or an Amendment to Trust may be necessary. This list is not all-inclusive.

CHANGES IN FAMILY RELATIONS

- 1. Dissolution of a marriage (divorce)
- 2. Death of a spouse
- 3. Marriage of a single person
- 4. Changes regarding children, grandchildren, or other beneficiary:

Birth of a child Death of a child

Marriage of a child Marriage dissolution of a child

Adoption of a child Illness of a child

Attitude change toward Testator Financial irresponsibility

Economic change (good fortune or bad fortune)

CHANGES IN ECONOMIC AND PERSONAL CONDITION OF TESTATOR

- 5. Asset values -- increase or decrease
- 6. Change in insurability -- life insurance
- 7. Changes in employment (e.g., position or employer changes)
- 8. Change in business interests (e.g., new partnership, new corporations)
- 9. Property acquired in a different state
- 10. Change in health or life situation of Testator, spouse, or dependent which may require extra help or protection
- 11. Retirement from business or profession

EXTERNAL CHANGES

- 12. Changes in laws: state and federal income, estate tax, gift tax, property, trusts, probate
- 13. Change of residence to different state
- 14. Death of executor, trustee, or guardian, or inability or unwillingness to serve
